By the authority in Us vested, We hereby require and direct you, and all Officers and other persons belonging to or employed in His Majesty's Dockyards, so far as the duties of each are concerned, to make yourself acquainted with, and carefully observe and comply with, the General Regulations contained in this book for the Government of His Majesty's Dockyards at Home.

As in a business of so multifarious and extensive a nature as that of His Majesty's Dockyards, circumstances may occur for which no specific instructions can be prepared beforehand, every person employed therein is expected to show an interest in His Majesty's Service, and to exert himself to fulfil not only the letter but the spirit of our Instructions; and in cases in which no particular directions have been given, to promote the welfare of the Public Service to the utmost of his power.

All directions issued from time to time by our authority, which add to or modify these Regulations, are to be carefully noted in all copies in use in the Dockyard; and the several Superintendents are to report to Us annually, not later than the 14th of January, that this has been done.

In so far as these regulations deal with matters of a general character affecting establishments other than the Dockyards properly so called, they are applicable to all Admiralty Civil Establishments at Home, provided they are not in conflict with any special instructions which may be laid down for particular classes of establishments.

Detailed Instructions for the conduct of the work in the several departments will be found in the Handbooks which are issued to avoid the necessity of inserting a large amount of

detail in a book of General Instructions. These handbooks are to be considered as issued "By Authority," and the Instructions contained therein are to be duly observed.
